Unfortunately the dog fouling is an issue again on the path near school. I have been in contact with the local councillor about this. It is really important you report people if you see this happening.


Your feedback is always important to us. After the half term we will be asking you to let us know the three things you think we do well and three things you think we could improve.

Attendance

35 children continue to have 100% attendance which is a fantastic achievement! Unfortunately we also have 35 children who have attendance below 96%. If your child's attendance is below 90% then they considered to be a persistent absentee.

Please note that school does not authorise holidays in term time. Fines will be issued when 7 school days are missed. Please try to ensure appointments are made out of school hours. When this is not possible please ensure that children are in school at 9am or 1pm for their registration.

Free School Meals

If your family circumstances have changed you may be entitled to apply for Free School Meals.

You can apply for **free school meals** if you receive any of the following: Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or **Child** Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less.

If you are eligible then your child will receive a **free school lunch- saving £10.25 per week**. School also receives additional funding which can be used towards **subsidising visits**, **clubs**, **music lessons** or providing additional support in class.

School also receives £300 in funding if a parent is serving in the armed forces.

This information is confidential and other children, parents etc. do not know. The children themselves do not usually know! In order for us to check we only need your date of birth and National Insurance number. Please speak to Mrs Murray or Mrs Smith who can answer any questions you may have.

Sporting Achievements
