Class Dojo

Please note our Dojo system is a great way to pass messages to the teacher or to myself. However there are times when we are not logged in and so it may take some time for you to get a response. Urgent messages are best passed to the person on the gate who will record it in the book and ensure it is passed on immediately.

Behaviour- we have introduced some corridor monitors. Their job is to ensure children walk through school quietly at lunchtime and use the toilets appropriately (not as a play area!) We are keen to ensure our high standards of behaviour are maintained in corridors as well as in the classrooms.

Sats- after the holidays both the Year 2 children and the Year 6 children will be sitting their Sats assessments. We are very conscious to avoid any anxiety amongst the children. Please help us by reinforcing the message that as long as the children try their best that is any of us can ask!
