- 2. The profile of PE and Sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a <u>range of sports and activities</u> offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
