#### Online Safety

Keeping our children safe online is of the utmost importance for all of us. It can be really difficult to monitor what our children 'go on' on their devices, even when we've added parental controls. We educate the children about how to be safe online and they know exactly the right thing to say but they don't always follow this guidance as they don't think anything will happen to them. We are becoming increasingly concerned that children are accessing social media or playing computer games that are not age appropriate. Some children are doing this either early in

the morning or very late at night. Age ratings and restrictions are there for a reason and it is important that we keep our children safe and away from harmful content.

Please check their phones so you know they are safe!

### Nutmeg and Sprout:

Our Wrap around care provider have places for after school.

Sessions are from 3:10pm - 6:00pm Monday to Friday.

Children enjoy a wide range of play and learning opportunities with their friends, including themed activities. Light snacks and drinks are provided.

Sessions need to be booked in advance for staffing purposes with ratios.

#### Safeguarding:

Should you have a concern about a child outside of school you can report this yourself anonymously on 03000 267979. **Birthday cakes:** We promote healthy eating in school but as you may guess, the children like to keep bringing cakes in on their birthday. Please be aware of allergies of other children in the class and the number.

If you choose to send a full cake then this must be cut into the correct number of pieces as staff cannot cut it.

We appreciate this has a cost attached so please do not feel any pressure to bring anything in.

Keeping children safe is our number one priority and we always respond immediately to any concerns.

#### Parking:


Please do not use the car park for collecting children from after school clubs.
